The survey findings will be used to identify gaps in how services provide support for survivors, and argue for steps to make existing services better equipped to assist people in situations of violence.

In this survey, we want to find out about how you experienced using services delivered by community organisations in Australia. This could include services like refuges, helplines, family relationships centres, sexual assault services, legal services or housing support services etc. At this stage we are not collecting information on experiences with courts, hospitals or police.

This survey will take you approximately 15-17 minutes to complete. The survey is anonymous and does not require you to disclose your name or the services you've used unless you choose to. We will be using the survey findings on an anonymous basis in our advocacy and written submissions to relevant government departments as well as sharing the findings with other community organisations that are working to end gender-based violence.

The survey closes on the 31st of January. This survey is open to people over 15 years old.


